From the Principal...

Welcome back everyone! Many thanks to the students, parents, teachers, support staff and extended family members who contributed to remote learning over the past week. We have worked hard to ensure learning continuity for our students—well done everyone!

Welcome Aboard!

On Monday 7th, students will notice a new staff member onsite. Robert Ball is an Integration Aide who will be working to support students in the Prep and 1/2 classes. He has a background in the Arts, community projects, and has experience supporting students with Autism in a specialist school setting.

Long Service Leave

Mr Ahyick-Wong will be taking Long Service Leave, commencing 9th June. He will return on Monday 26th July. In his place, we have Ms Pam Lenders, who is well known to the school. Ms Lenders has many years' teaching experience and is looking forward to working with our wonderful Grade 4 students in Mr Ahyick-Wong's absence.

After School Care

School Council has entered into an agreement with Our Patch Education to commence an After School Care program. Initially, the program will run on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays after school. We hope to be able to build the program to run before and after school throughout the week. This will ultimately depend on program enrolments and school community interest. Once the licence has been approved by the Education Department, we will be able to advise you of a starting date. Our Patch will be running a parent information session next term. The date is to be advised.

COVID-19 Restrictions

With our return to school, comes a number of **temporary** restrictions that are now in place:

Attendance on-site

It is important that your child is kept at home if he/she has:

- a temperature (more than 37.5)
- a cough
- a runny nose
- a sore throat
- muscle aches

Non-essential visitors should be excluded from school sites for this period. Parents may enter the office area when picking up or dropping off students, however all other access is now restricted at this time.

Additional staff, including parent volunteers and instrumental music teachers, must not attend school at this time.

Schools must not conduct on-site school tours for prospective students and their families at this time.

School arrival and departure

We are required to reduce interaction between students and adults at the beginning and end of the day. As such, we ask that parents do not linger while picking up and dropping off students.

Face masks & 1.5m distancing

All adults must wear face masks when onsite, unless teaching or presenting to an audience.

This important event has been postponed until Term 3—26th-28th July.

Instrumental Music Lessons

These cannot take place next week, but should be back in action after the long weekend.
