From the Principal...

Welcome back to Term 4! I hope that everyone has had a fantastic and restful holiday and is ready for another term of learning. As you can see from the calendar, it is a very busy term ahead!

Learning News

I would like to remind you that children should be reading each night. In the lower grades it is imperative that families listen to children at least 5 times a week. As the children become independent readers they should be reading and talking to you about their books. Reading diaries should also be filled out each day by families or students. Research tells us that children who read regularly at home from birth become better readers and are more likely to have successful life outcomes. We are wanting to improve our connection with reading at home by supporting you as families to prioritise reading to, with and by your children as part of your home life. If dairies have been lost or are not coming home, please contact your child's teacher.

Beginning next week, staff will be commencing a Professional Learning Community Cycle in the area of Mathematics. Using student and NAPLAN data, we have identified an area for improvement in Place Value. The PLC cycle is a tool that enables us to improve our teaching, resulting in best practice and improved outcomes for your children.

Woolworths Junior Blaster Cricket 2019

Are there any keen young cricketers out there? Hopefully our Aussie team's effort in the Ashes Series against England has provided inspiration. The Trentham District Cricket Club is again running the **Woolworths Junior Blaster Cricket** program for boys and girls aged 5 to 8 starting Wednesday 16th October. This is the second year with Woolworths as the sponsor partner for Cricket Victoria and the program forms part of the **Woolworths Cricket Blast** program for Primary School children to teach them cricket and team skills in a fun environment.

The Trentham Cricket Club invites junior cricketers and their parents to take part in this program at the Trentham Primary School on Wednesdays after school from **16th October until 11th December**.

Mark Reid will again run the **Junior Blaster Cricket** program but would very much appreciate volunteer parents to assist in the supervision of the children and games each week. Such assistance is essential to help the activities to run smoothly and safely. Prior knowledge of the game of cricket is not needed to help Mark with the program. A Cricket Australia clinic is likely to be held soon at the Trentham Primary School to introduce children to the program's different activities. Parents are strongly encouraged to come along and observe this. This year's **Junior Blaster Cricket** program will begin with an optional **information session** for interested children and their parents at the Trentham Primary School at **3:15pm on Tuesday 15th October**. The **first program session** will be held the following day, **Wednesday 16th October** from **3:15 until 4:30pm** at the Trentham Primary School grounds. Sessions will be held each Wednesday thereafter (weather permitting) from **3:30 to 4:30pm until 11th December 2019**. Mark advises that the program is best suited to boys and girls aged from 5 to 8 years.

The **Junior Blaster Cricket** program offers youngsters the opportunity to learn great cricket skills such as batting, bowling, catching and throwing and encourages them to make friends in a team sport environment. The program will cater for the younger, inexperienced children as well as the more experienced children. The total cost for the program for each junior participant remains at **\$75**. Registration and payment can all be done on-line on the PlayCricket website (type in Trentham Cricket Club). On-line payment is the accepted secure method of payment and parents/guardians can also select and pay on-line for additional items if desired. Included in the \$75 program cost is a cricket pack which includes a bat, backpack, ball, hat, shirt and a few other goodies. Mark will place the order for the packs once all participants are registered.

The new program aims to continue providing fun ways to keep kids active and healthy, and introduce them to a team sport environment at an early age. Mark looks forward to meeting interested children and their parents/guardians at the school on Tuesday 15th October from 3:15pm or the following day at 3:15pm prior to the start of the first program session. Renowned Aboriginal singer/songwriter and proud Mutti Mutti man, Kutcha Edwards, performs music that fuses his beautiful voice with soulful arrangements and an original approach to the blues. Kutcha's path has taken him from a child institutionalised to winning the Melbourne Prize for Music. Removed from his family and culture he has recaptured his Songline and spends his life casting 'pebbles in to the pond' creating wave upon wave of cultural awareness through his music and performance charisma.

Kutcha will be presenting a singing workshop from 2pm in the afternoon at Tylden Hall and the evening concert will commence at 7pm, with supper and drinks available from 6pm. Support acts for The Kutcha Edwards Hour are local talents, Jarrod Shaw and Allison Walsh, Jarrod was born and raised in country Victoria, down the dirt roads of the Macedon Ranges. He taught himself to play guitar listening to the renowned blues greats, as well as the icons of the Australian and local Melbourne blues scene.

He blends his unique guitar approach lying somewhere between piedmont fingerstyle and the blues of the delta, with wailing blues harp and a powerful voice often described as belying his years.

Allison Walsh and students from Trentham District Primary School will share the songs from The Mission Songs Project and Dhungala Choral Connection, learned whilst working with The Boite.
